









## China CITIC Bank International The 15th Asian Dragon Boat Championships coming in October

Asia's top-level dragon boat race is returning to Hong Kong 27 years after the city's reunification with the motherland

Elite dragon boat teams from 13 Asian countries and regions are joining the race in Hong Kong for the highest honour in Asia's dragon boat racing scene. At the press conference today, Mr Lao Kam, President, Hong Kong China Dragon Boat Association, Mr Chung Chi-lok, Chairman, Hong Kong China Dragon Boat Association, Mr Bi Mingqiang, Executive Director, President & Chief Executive Officer, China

CITIC Bank International Limited, alongside Hon Kenneth Leung Yuk-wai, JP, Member of the Legislative Council of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region, and Dr Kwok Chi-leung BBS, Vice President, Sports Federation & Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China, kicked off the Championships.

The biennial Championships is a main event in the dragon boat racing calendar. A first-time host back in 1996, Hong Kong welcomes back the Championships since its reunification with the motherland. Mr Lao Kam, President, Hong Kong China Dragon Boat Association, said: "Dragon boating originated in China. We look to the Championships to promoting dragon boat racing as an international competitive sport, with an aim also to spread the Chinese culture and promote perseverance, collaboration and sportsmanship displayed by members of the dragon boat elite teams".

Mr Chung Chi-lok, Chairman, Hong Kong China Dragon Boat Association, noted: "Held at the Kwun Tong waterfront, the Champions will draw members of the general public closer to the sport, making a contribution to the development of Kowloon East a major venue for water sports."

Mr Bi Mingqiang, Executive Director, President & Chief Executive Officer, China CITIC Bank International Limited, remarked: "A Chinese bank with a century-old heritage in Hong Kong, China CITIC Bank International embraces the responsibility to drive social progress and facilitate prosperity. China CITIC Bank International The 15th Asian Dragon Boat Championships will see more than 800 dragon boat elite team members from 13 countries and regions, including more than 100 from Hong Kong China, compete for the championships. The races will cover 100m, 200m, 500m and 2,000m, in categories encompassing open group, mixed group and women's group with the majority of the races on 12-person small dragons and 22-person medium dragons. There will also be a 12-person dragon boat race for a U24 youth group. In celebration of the 75th anniversary of the founding of the People's Republic of China, China CITIC Bank International will also organise a China CITIC Bank International National Day Cup – a friendly match among dragon boat teams from Hong Kong corporations and other institutions for the enjoyment of members of the general public.

The stage and an auditorium are set at the Kwon Tong waterfront for the Championships from 11 to 13 October to welcome Hong Hong citizens who are invited to feel the vibes and cheer for the athletes. A total of 14 traditional Chinese game stalls and souvenir kiosks as well as

an exhibition of dragon boat equipment will engage visitors in the dragon boat fun. During the Championships, the venue is open from 10am to 5pm daily. Admission is free.
